STUDY GUIDE: "Taming the Tongue"

Discussion Starters

- 1. Do you believe that someone can be perfectly qualified for a job, but disqualified because of a character flaw? Why/why not?
- 2. "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words will never hurt me." That is a well-known idiom that illustrates a truth that the words spoken do not have the ability to hurt someone. Do you believe that?

Read: Psalm 19:14, Ephesians 4:25-29, Matthew 12:33-37, Proverbs 12:16-23, Proverbs 29:20, Proverbs 25:11, Colossians 3:17, James 3:1-12

Questions

- 3. Why does James discourage people to become teachers? What is happening in the lives of the people that makes him say this? How can the sins of a teacher hurt the pupils?
- 4. In verse 6, James says that the tongue is a fire that defiles the whole body; another way to say this is that it stains the whole body. Based on this section of scripture (James 3:1-12) how does this happen? How have you seen this happen in the world?
- 5. How do verses 8-12 show us how unnaturally sinful our tongues can be? What steps can you take to change this?

- 6. Have you sinned against someone with your words and not sought forgiveness? What will you do this week to reconcile that?
- 7. Is there an area of sin that you must address and work on in order to be used to share the gospel?
